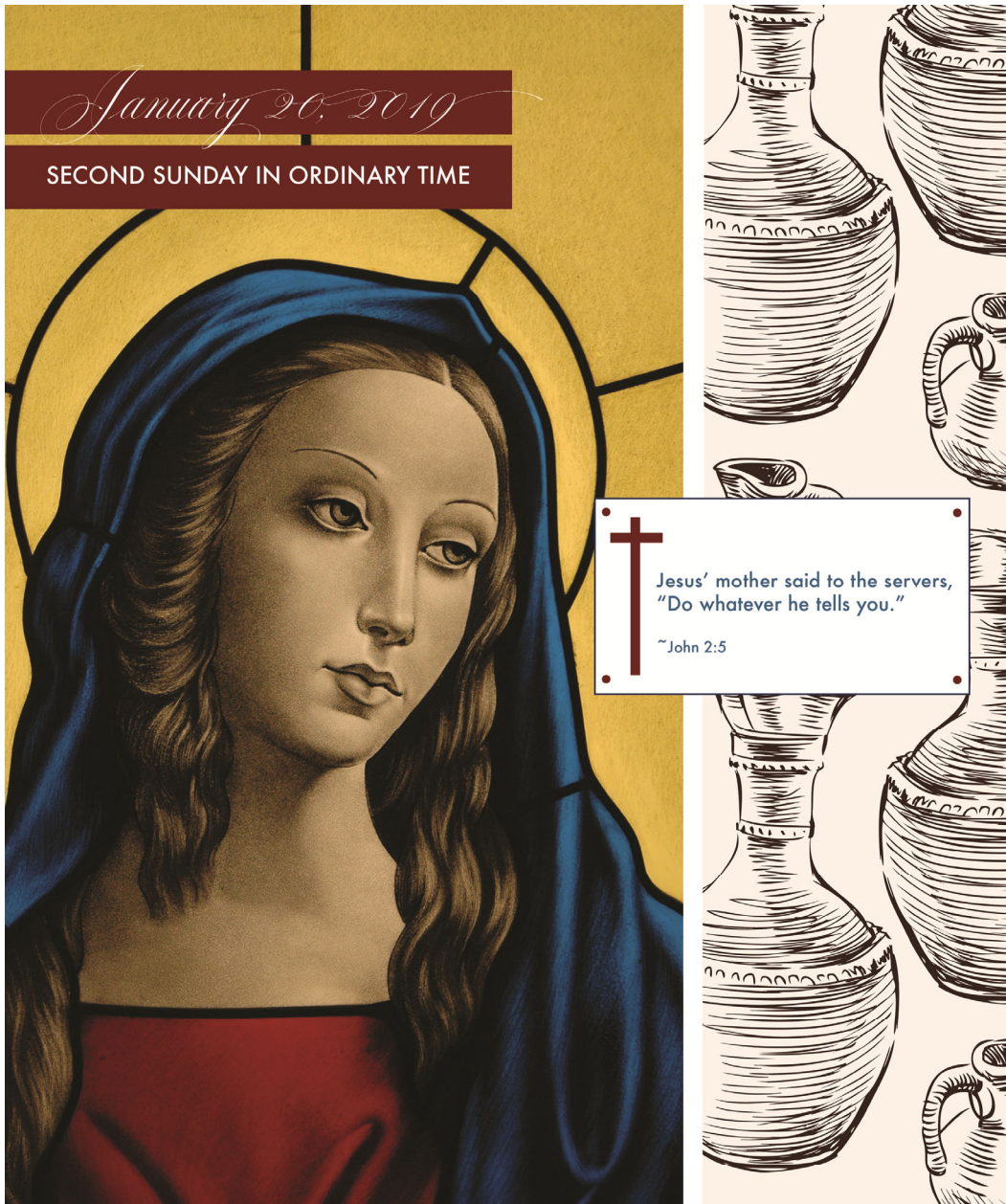

December, 2018 Bulletin Report

- Weekly Collections for December totaled - \$28,987.99. Our budget for the same period is \$28,400.00 which means we were \$587.99 over **budget** for the month. Currently, the total weekly collections for this fiscal year are \$160,187.55. Our 2018/2019 fiscal year’s weekly collection goal is \$301,000. We do thank everyone for their generous support.

Gift Card sales for the month totaled \$18,640.00 showing a profit of \$791.99. Last year’s total for the same timeframe were: sales of \$21,875.00 for a profit of \$1,001.75.
