**April is Child Abuse Prevention Month**

**Did you know: People can be taught to identify grooming behavior?** Grooming behaviors are the actions which abusers take to project the image that they are kind, generous, caring people, while their intent is to lure a minor into an inappropriate relationship. An abuser may develop a relationship with the family to increase his credibility. Abusers might show attention to the child by talking to him/her, being friendly, sharing alcohol with a minor and giving the child status by insinuating that the child is their favorite or special person. Offenders can be patient and may groom their victim, his or her family, or community for years.

**Did you know: Background checks work?** Background checks in churches, schools and other organizations keep predators away from children both because they scare off some predators and because they uncover past actions which should ban an adult from working or volunteering with children. If an adult has had difficulty with some boundaries that society sets, such as not driving while intoxicated or not disturbing the public peace, he or she may have difficulties with other boundaries, such as not hurting a child. Never forget that offenders lie.

**Weekly Financial Report**

The Weekly Financial Report was unavailable before this week's bulletin deadline. The April 22 report will be published on May 6, 2018.

**March, 2018 Bulletin Report**

Weekly Collections for March totaled - \$22,302.83, or an average \$5,575.98/week.

Our budget for the same period is \$22,640 which means we were \$336.17 **under budget** for the month. Weekly Collections for the fiscal year ending in March are \$201,075.27. Our budget for weekly collections is \$220,740. We do thank everyone for their generous support.

Gift Card sales for the month totaled \$13,205 showing a profit of \$573.83. Total sales so far for this fiscal year are \$130,160 for a profit of \$5,686.61. Last year's total for the same time-frame were: sales of \$114,885 for a profit of \$4,744.25.
