Weekly Collections for September totaled - \$20,058.19, or an average \$5,014.55/week.

- Our budget for the same period is \$22,720.00 which means we were \$2,661.81 **under budget** for the month. Currently, the total weekly collections for this fiscal year are \$70,887.64. Our 2018/2019 fiscal year's weekly collection goal is \$301,000. We do thank everyone for their generous support. Gift Card sales for the month totaled \$14,105 showing a profit of \$648.94. Last year's total for the same timeframe were: sales of \$14,965 for a profit of \$646.36.
